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# WHY?

- How do people receive information?
  - Access
- What role does information access play in societies/cultures?
- How is information accessed?
- What is the impact of access-at-all-costs sites?
  - (pun not intended, but acknowledged)





## CURRENT LANDSCAPE

\$1,000 in one week for a PhD student in Iran to pay for access to necessary papers for their own research meets any sensible threshold of being unreasonable (Bohannon, 2016)

Several options exist:

- Various Levels of Open Access
- Publisher Big Deals
- Black Access
- Concerted Movements
- Government
- Private

Researchers are just looking for access

How is this achieved ethically and without bringing the scholarly world crashing down?

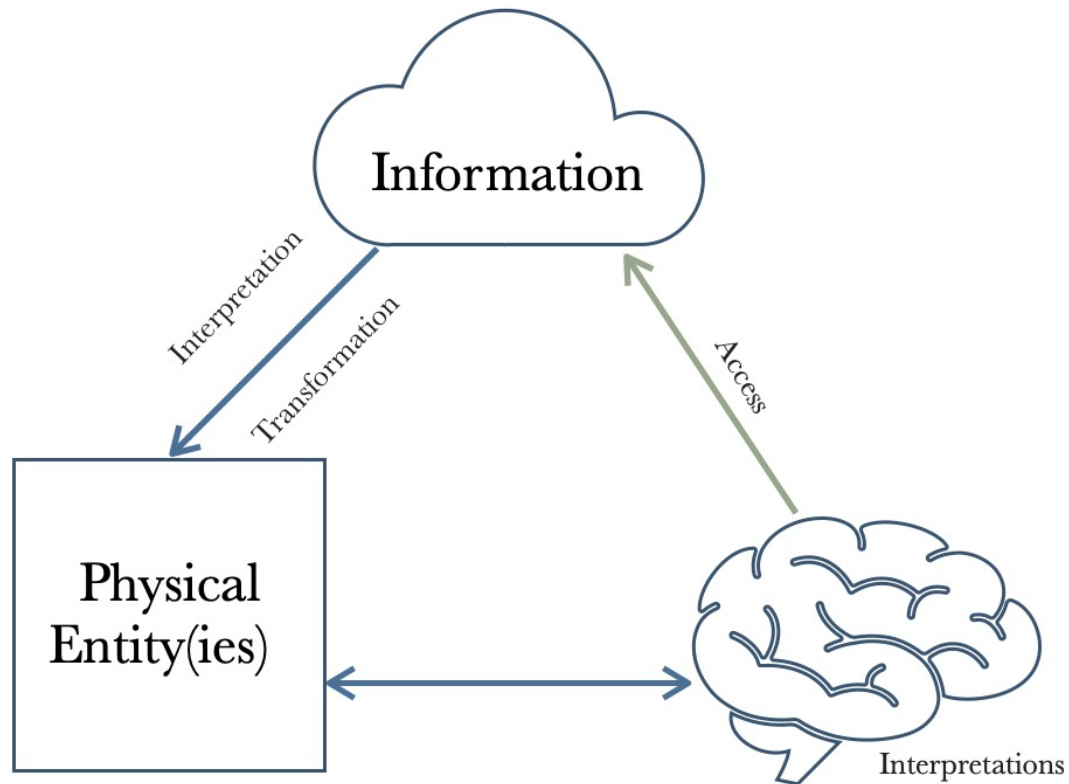
- Open Access (e.g. Plan S in Europe- publicly funded works be available to public)

# CONVENTIONAL ARGUMENTS AGAINST BLACK ACCESS SITES

- Moral:
  - Stealing is wrong
  - Somebody's intellectual property/efforts
- Bureaucratic
  - Producing/verifying/disseminating/sustaining scholarly work takes funding
  - People live in the real world- need to make a living

- Philosophy of information
  - Information-as-abstract (Dinneen & Brauner, 2017)
  - Objective and veridical (Mingers & Standing, 2018)
- Gardening Book Example
  - information vs non-information
  - “How to garden”





## Merits

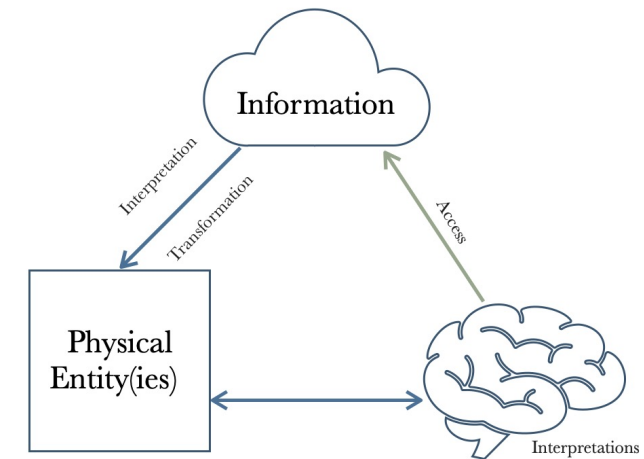
- Gives people access 🙌
- Altruistic in its intent
- “Forces the issue” to the publishing industry

## Detriments

- Hacker mentality (Bohannon, 2016)
  - Nature of piracy
- Culture of disruption
  - Consequences down the line?
- Does it achieve what it purports to?
  - Usage data suggests convenience rather than necessity (Nicholas, et al. 2019.)

# THE THREATS

- Threat to the integrity of information from Black Access sites is twofold
  1. BA sites undermine their own goal to provide information to everyone
    - information not disseminated is a threat unto itself
  2. Could Threaten Information-as-abstract through disingenuous content
- Undermining Open Access:
  - Wealthy, research-producing nations drive effort
    - Innovation
  - BA sites lower demand for OA
- Culture of Disrupt
  - Dissatisfaction with any change
